There are major issues and changes that could greatly impact the construction industry and other Public Works related areas. Brian also will discuss the overall state of the CCDD facilities, the operators’ response to potential changes, the Illinois EPA perspective, and shared important information about the effect on the individual contractor, sub-contractor, owner and facility operator in terms of new procedures and overall changes to the allowable materials and soil permitted to CCDD facilities.

A brief Panel Discussion will include a Facility Owner, Contractor, Sub-contractor, Consultant, a Facility Operator and others. They will share insight with the group about how these changes could affect our current methods and how soils are classified and handled.
